Who We Are

Queen's University Faculty Association (QUFA) represents regular and adjunct academic staff. It is governed by an executive committee, a council of representatives from academic departments and units, and by voting Members who attend general meetings in the fall and spring.

Executive committee members and council representatives are elected from and by voting Members. They are faculty, librarians, and archivists like you, who have chosen to serve the interests of our Queen's colleagues by getting involved in QUFA.

Membership in QUFA

QUFA is the bargaining agent for all of its Members. That means that all academic staff are covered by the contract that QUFA negotiates with the university administration. All academic staff are entitled to have their rights as employees protected by QUFA and to vote to ratify new contracts. For that reason, everyone contributes a small portion of their salary to QUFA dues.

Any regular or adjunct member who fills out a membership form can run for election, vote in leadership elections, or vote on matters pertaining to the governance of QUFA. Return a completed membership form to join.

What QUFA Does

QUFA has a number of roles, responsibilities, and functions. Some of the most important are:

- **Negotiate** new contracts for Members. The current contract expires in 2015, so you'll be hearing more about this soon.
- **Help** all Members when they have questions or concerns about the terms and conditions of their work at Queen's.
- **Promote** high-quality education by ensuring Members can do their job to the best of their abilities.
- **Represent** all Members and their interests in the running of the Association.
- **Report** to Members about our activities in a regular and responsible way.
- **Deal** ethically and honestly with other constituents of the Queen's University community.
- **Inform** Members of broader issues in higher education that matter to them.
